

Victorian 18ct Gold and Cornelian Signet Ring, 1893

Description

A handsome late Victorian signet ring in rich 18ct yellow gold, set with a warm cornelian tablet and hallmarked in Birmingham in 1893. Substantial yet elegantly proportioned, this is a fine example of a classic form that has remained an enduring symbol of personal style, identity, and heritage.

The smooth cornelian panel offers a pleasing contrast to the deep, mellow yellow gold. Prized since antiquity for its warm red-orange tone and suitability for engraving, cornelian was a traditional choice for signet rings. It could be left beautifully plain, as here, or later personalised with an engraved crest, initials, or family device.

The ring's clean, confident design is characteristic of late 19th-century English jewellery, when traditional forms were made with generous materials and a strong emphasis on quality. Its 18ct gold construction gives it a satisfying weight and luxurious feel, while the Birmingham hallmarks provide a precise record of its place and year of manufacture.

A refined and highly wearable antique jewel, equally suited as a gentleman's signet ring, a distinctive unisex statement piece, or a thoughtful personal gift. It would make an excellent addition to a collection of Victorian jewellery, antique signet rings, or British hallmarked gold.
