Description

A pair of 19th century English/Irish glass creamers with cut glass diamond pattern circa 1880.

Creamer jugs, also known as cream pitchers, have been used for centuries to serve cream or milk alongside tea and coffee. Popular in Europe from the 18th century onward, they were often crafted from silver, porcelain, pottery, or glass to complement fashionable tea sets.

Georgian and Victorian examples frequently featured elegant curves, decorative handles, and ornate engraving, reflecting the tastes of the period. In the 20th century, Art Deco and modernist styles introduced simpler, more streamlined forms.

Today, antique creamer jugs are widely collected for their craftsmanship, historical charm, and variety of designs, ranging from rustic country pottery to highly decorative fine silver pieces.
