## Description

A striking 1960s Modernist ring in white gold, set with a cultured pearl and diamonds. Its sculptural design reflects the confident, forward-looking style of mid-century jewellery, when designers embraced bold forms, clean lines, and an expressive interplay between precious materials.

At its centre, the cultured pearl brings a soft, luminous presence to the design. Its gentle iridescence is beautifully offset by the cool sheen of white gold and the crisp sparkle of the diamond accents. The contrast of smooth pearl, brilliant diamonds, and sharply defined metalwork gives the ring a distinctive sense of texture and movement.

Modernist jewellery of the 1960s was admired for its individuality and architectural character. Rather than relying on elaborate traditional ornament, pieces of this period often used asymmetry, volume, and negative space to create visual impact. This ring captures that spirit perfectly: elegant and refined, yet unmistakably of its era.
