Description

An elegant French Art Deco platinum long bar brooch, dating to circa 1925 and set with twenty-six brilliant-cut diamonds. Its elongated, highly stylised silhouette perfectly captures the restrained glamour of the period, when clean geometry, fine materials, and an emphasis on light became central to jewellery design.

The brooch is finely crafted in platinum, chosen for its strength and naturally white tone, which enhances the brightness and fire of the diamonds. The twenty-six brilliant-cut stones are arranged in a precise linear composition, creating a continuous ribbon of light across the length of the jewel. The simplicity of the setting allows the quality of the design and the lively sparkle of the diamonds to take centre stage.

A gold fitting provides a discreet and practical contrast to the platinum mount. This combination of platinum, diamonds, and gold is characteristic of high-quality early 20th-century jewellery, balancing technical refinement with everyday wearability.

Long bar brooches were an essential accessory of the 1920s and could be worn across the shoulder, at the neckline, on a lapel, or to secure a scarf or stole. This example remains exceptionally versatile: refined enough for formal evening wear, yet sufficiently understated to bring a touch of Art Deco elegance to a modern jacket or dress.

A beautiful and timeless jewel, offering the crisp sophistication of French Art Deco design and the enduring appeal of platinum and diamonds.
