Description

A handsome and complete Liberty & Co. London Tudric pewter tea service, dating to circa 1920 and comprising a matching tray, coffee pot, teapot, and hot-water pot. Each piece is fully stamped, confirming its origin with one of Britain's most influential names in Arts & Crafts and Art Nouveau design.

The service displays the restrained elegance for which Tudric pewter is celebrated. Its softly lustrous surface, balanced proportions, and carefully considered functional forms give the set a quiet but unmistakable presence. Produced for Liberty & Co., Tudric wares brought high-quality, progressive design to the early 20th-century table, combining the hand-crafted spirit of the Arts & Crafts movement with a more streamlined modern sensibility.

The three pots create an impressive and practical suite for serving tea and coffee, while the accompanying tray brings the ensemble together as a cohesive table service. Their harmonious design makes the set equally effective in use or as a decorative display, whether arranged on a sideboard, in a dining room, or within a collection of British decorative arts.

A fine and increasingly desirable example of Liberty & Co. metalware from the interwar period. With every element present and fully marked, this is a particularly appealing service for collectors of Tudric pewter, Arts & Crafts design, and early 20th-century British silver and metalware.
